# **Quarterly Report Statistics and Information**

### **Referrals of Fraud and Prosecutions**

### A. Arkansas Attorney General's Medicaid Fraud Control Unit

Pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 20-77-2506, the Medicaid Inspector General shall work with the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit (MFCU) of the Office of the Arkansas Attorney General, prosecuting attorneys, and law enforcement agencies. The Medicaid Inspector General refers audit investigations to MFCU when there is a credible allegation of fraud. See 42 CFR § 455.23.

From April 1, 2021 to June 30, 2021, **seven (7)** Medicaid provider investigations have been referred to the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit of the Attorney General's Office.

From April 1, 2021 to June 30, 2021, the Attorney General's Office obtained **two (2)** criminal convictions in which the defendant was ordered to pay restitution. The Attorney General's Office had **two (2)** arrests. Total restitution collected from criminal convictions during this time was \$ **4,922.95**. Total restitution collected from civil cases during this quarter was \$3,500.00.

### **B. Other Suspected Fraud Referrals**

In addition to referrals of suspected fraud to the Arkansas Attorney General's Office, OMIG shall also make referrals and coordinate efforts with other federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. See Ark. Code Ann. §20-77-2506(2).

From April 1, 2021 to June 30, 2021, **thirty-two (32)** Medicaid recipients have been referred to the appropriate agency for further investigation.
